

Commercial Part 61 Requirements



250 hours of total flight time including:

- 100 hours* of PIC time which includes 50 hours cross-country PIC
- 20 hours of flight training time with a qualified flight instructor including at least:
 - 10 hours of instrument training time with a CFII
 - 10 hours training in a complex airplane and/or a TAA airplane (G1000 aircraft)
 - One 2-hour cross-country flight in daytime conditions that consists of a total straight-line distance of more than 100 NM
 - One 2-hour cross-country flight in nighttime conditions that consists of a total straight-line distance of more than 100 NM
 - 3 hours in a single-engine airplane in preparation for the practical test within the preceding 2 calendar months of the date of the test
- 10 hours of solo flight time (solo is defined as the sole occupant of the airplane) including:

- One cross-country flight not less than 300 NM total distance with landings at a minimum of three points, and one segment of the flight consisting of a straight-line distance of at least 250 NM; and
- 5 hours in night VFR conditions with 10 takeoffs and 10 landings at an airport with an operating control tower
- Any remaining time is encouraged to be used for cross-country experience time with fellow students, solo, or with Eagle Aircraft Flight Academy instructors

*Each time requirement has a required amount of airplane time under that requirement. Refer to 61.129 or ask an Eagle Aircraft Flight Academy instructor for more details.
